

Relating our Reading to an unsolved Cold Case: Murdered: Eve Wilkowitz

A NY woman is found raped and murdered 3 blocks from her home.

On the evening of March 21, 1980, 20-year-old Eve Wilkowitz went out to dinner and saw a movie in Manhattan with her boyfriend, Jack Dempsey. They returned to Dempsey's home so Eve could take a quick nap and asked her boyfriend to wake her up in time to catch the 12:35 train back to Bayshore, Long Island. Eve worked in Manhattan for MacMillan Publishing House as a secretary.

Prior to her disappearance, Eve had expressed concern to her roommate, Robert Grogan, that she was being followed on her walks home from the train station. As a result, Eve would take a taxi from the station to her home. Police believe that the night Eve went missing she chose to walk the 10 minutes home from the train station. During this time, police believe she was kidnapped. During the early morning hours of March 23rd, 1980, Grogan noticed that Eve had not returned home. A few hours later, he would report her missing.

On March 25th, 1980, Eve's body is discovered after a woman notices a barefoot figure on her neighbor's lawn. She was wearing blue jeans and a blouse and her wrists had rope marks on them suggesting she was held captive for three days. Eve's socks and shoes were never found. Evidence would later show that she was sexually assaulted and the cause of death was strangulation.

A few months later, two other women would be killed near Long Island train stations. Paula Morris was a 17 year old high school honor student who was found shot to death approximately two blocks from the Copiague train station. While 22 year old Deborah Betz would be found stabbed to death also near the Copiague Train Station. The bodies of Paula Morris and Deborah Betz were found not far from where Eve's body was discovered.

In 1981, the FBI was able to establish an 'abstract profile' for Eve's killer. It is believed that her killer is a white male between the ages of 19 and 30 years old and drives an old but well-kept model performance car. It is also suspected that this individual lived in Eve's neighborhood at the time of her death. 




