


Missing: Robert Lyons

"It's been three years, one month and two weeks. He was a really good family man. It's been really hard,"

-Doreen Nahwahquaw, Robert's mother (July 2020)

Robert Lyons grew up on the Menominee Indian Reservation and with the strong and beautiful traditions of the Tribe. It is easy to see that Robert was proud of his heritage, which he expressed via several tattoos: "Menominee" on his back shoulder to shoulder, an eagle on the back of his neck, "Native Pride" on one of his calves, a bear on his left forearm, and "Lyons" with a feather on his right forearm. Unfortunately, it is here that Robert disappeared, leaving his family with many unanswered questions.

It was a beautiful Sunday in early June when Robert was last seen riding his ATV on the Menominee Reservation which is about 45



miles northwest of Green Bay. The temperature was very warm for upper Wisconsin in June, reaching nearly 90s degrees. He set out that afternoon wearing shorts and a hat. Some reports indicate that his shorts were red and white while others say it was the color of his ATV. Where he was headed is unclear, though a tribal police officer reportedly saw him riding near Long Marsh Road. He never returned home.

Because Robert had left his cell phone behind, his loved ones could only wait and hope that Robert would turn up. Four days later though their worries and fear would only escalate when his ATV was found abandoned near Maynard Loop near Long Marsh Rd. and Rush Lake Road. There was no sign of Robert or any indication of what happened to him.

Help bring Robert back home to his family. The Menominee Tribal police are offering a \$5000 reward for information on his disappearance.
